

Early in January, 2015, Boko Haram launched an attack on Baga and 15 surrounding villages, killing 2,000, burning 3,100 structures, and displacing 35,000 people. Their objective was to eliminate all Christians in the region.

► LIBYA – the killing fields for Christians

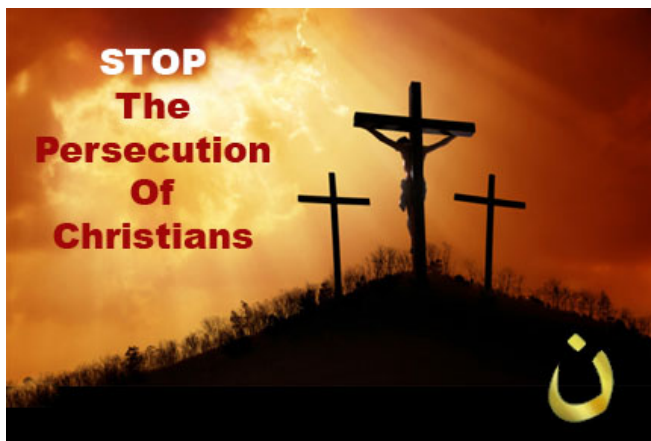
In February, 2015, 21 Coptic Christian migrant workers from Egypt were beheaded on the shore of the Mediterranean near Tripoli by ISIS. A video of these horrific murders, titled “A message signed with blood to the nation of the Cross,” was distributed world-wide.

This atrocity was repeated two months later when a group of 30 Ethiopian Christian migrant workers were lead to their death near the same location. This time the captives were shot and then beheaded – all recorded in a second shocking ISIS video. The message in the video was clear: Christians would not be safe unless they embrace Islam or pay protection money.

Since the fall of Maummar Gaddafi in October, 2011, Libya has been overrun by competing armed militias, many of them aligned with ISIS. For Christians, Libya has become the “killing fields” of the 21st Century.

Nun ن the Arabic alphabet “N” in our Roman alphabet is the first letter of the word Nasara (نصارى) -- Nazarenes. Muslims have called Christians this since the beginning of their invasion of the Christian world in the 7th century -- Christians under Muslim rule never called themselves by this pejorative word, since the intent of Muslims was to portray Christians as a contemptible and disobedient sect.

Stop the Worldwide Persecution of Christians

► IRAN

There are an estimated 250,000 Christians in Iran's 76 million strong population. They face torture, imprisonment or the death sentence under Sharia Law for not observing Islamic religious festivals and dress codes.

The Brussels-based organization Human Rights Without Frontiers named Iran as one of five countries with the largest number of "belief prisoners."

Saeed Abidini, an American Iranian pastor, has been jailed in Iran since 2012. Christians must practice their religion in secret due to Sharia Law.

► IRAQ

8/1/14 A family of 8 all sitting together with an open Bible were shot in the face and killed in Northern Iraq. -reported by Canon Andrew White.

Muslim terrorists marked each Christian owned institution or building with the Nun letter for the extermination of holdouts and expropriation of their belongings.

6/2014 Muslims, led by the ISIS jihadists captured Mosul. They removed the crosses from Mosul's Chaldean and Assyrian Orthodox Cathedrals and replaced them with the black flag of the Islamic State.

7/2014 Mosul, Iraq's 2nd largest city, has been emptied of almost all Christians. Over 10,000 have been forced to flee. The scant few who remained were weak, old or injured.

► SYRIA

5/13/14 Maaloula, Syria has suffered major destruction from warfare, according to the International Christian Concern. In addition to the damage to buildings, Maaloula's churches have been defaced with Islamic graffiti. Muslim rebels have damaged altars, defaced icons and paintings, removed or destroyed crosses and disturbed the tombs.

Who is a Muslim?

A Muslim is one who is obedient to the commands of Allah and examples of Muhammad.

4/2014 A Dutch priest who had refused to leave the besieged Syrian city of Homs in solidarity with its residents was beaten and then shot dead in his monastery.

► NIGERIA

On April 14-15, 2014, 275 high school girls, 92% of them Christian, were kidnapped from a government school by the Muslim terrorist organization Boko Haram. Only a few escaped. The remainder were sold into sex slavery for about \$12 each, and they have not been seen since.

7/27/14 A bomb blast killed at least 5 and injured 8 shortly after Mass ended at St. Charles church in Kano, Nigeria.
